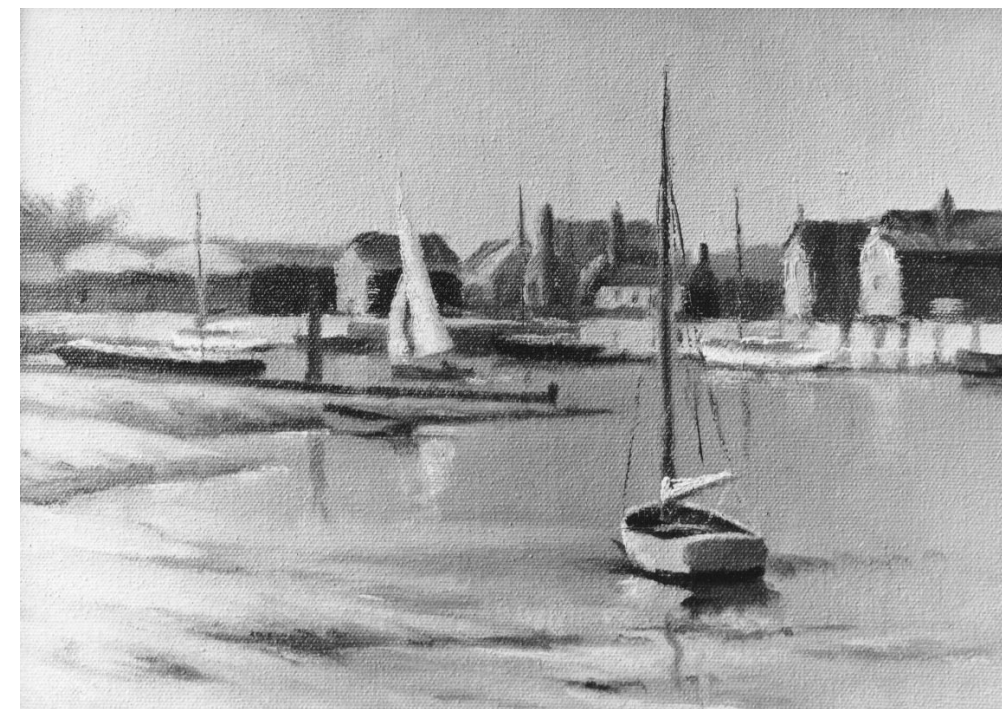

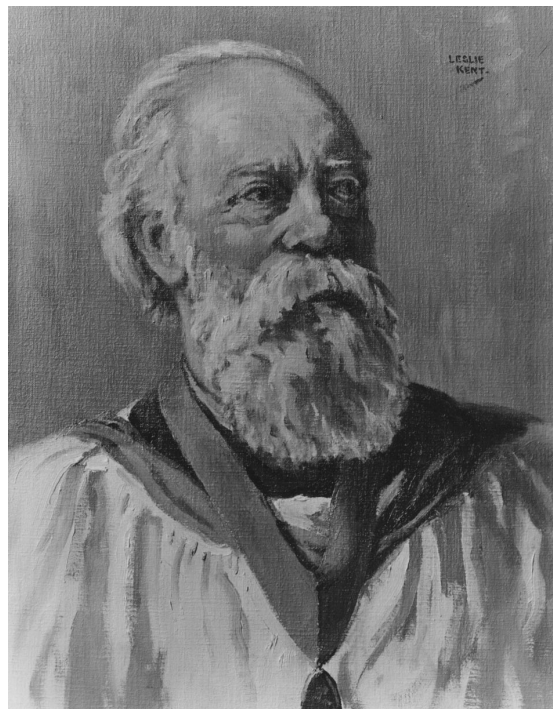

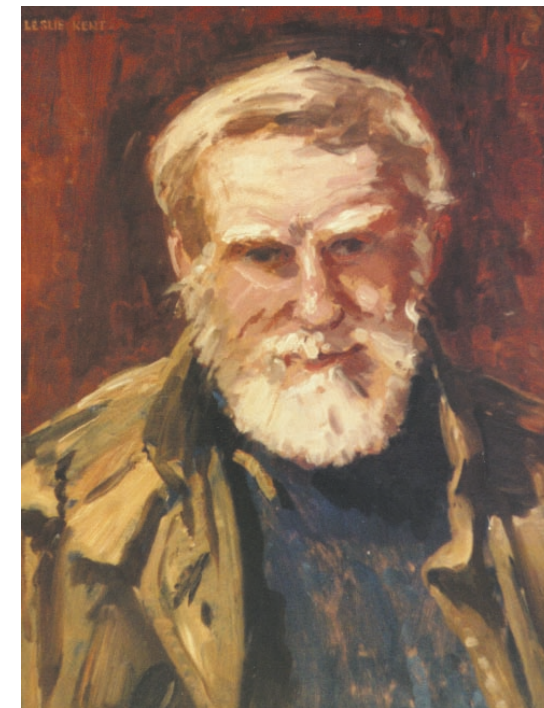
Married to Tita Brand, he had five children, one being a prominent member of SOE in WW2 and another son in the RAF being killed in action.

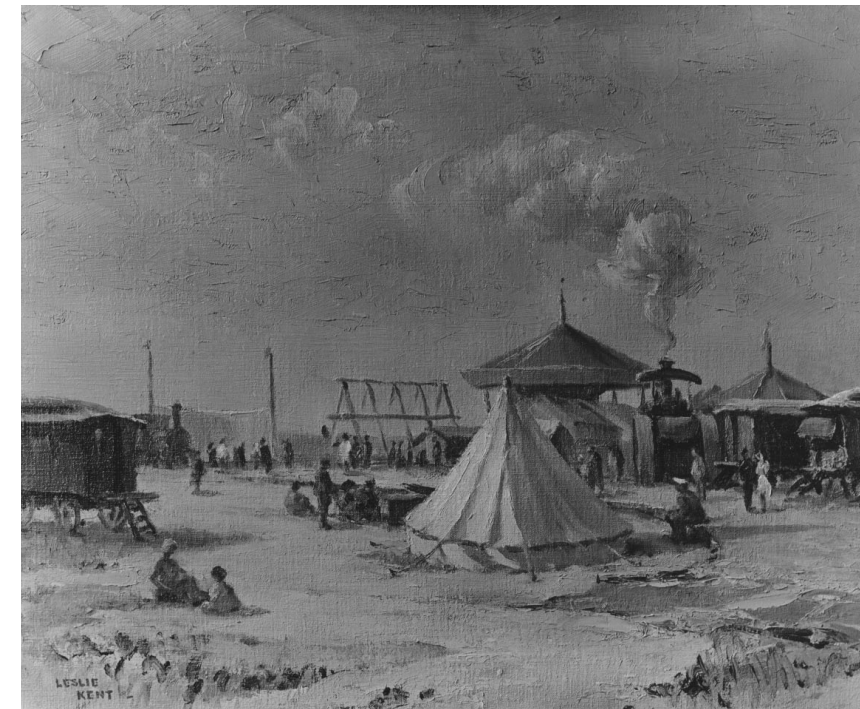

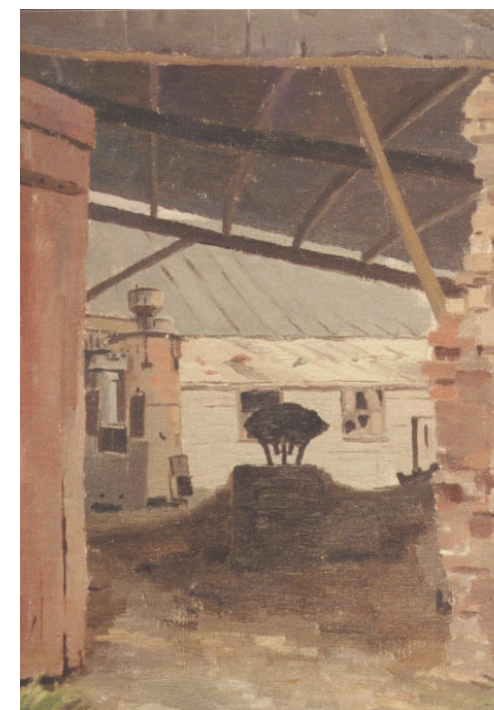

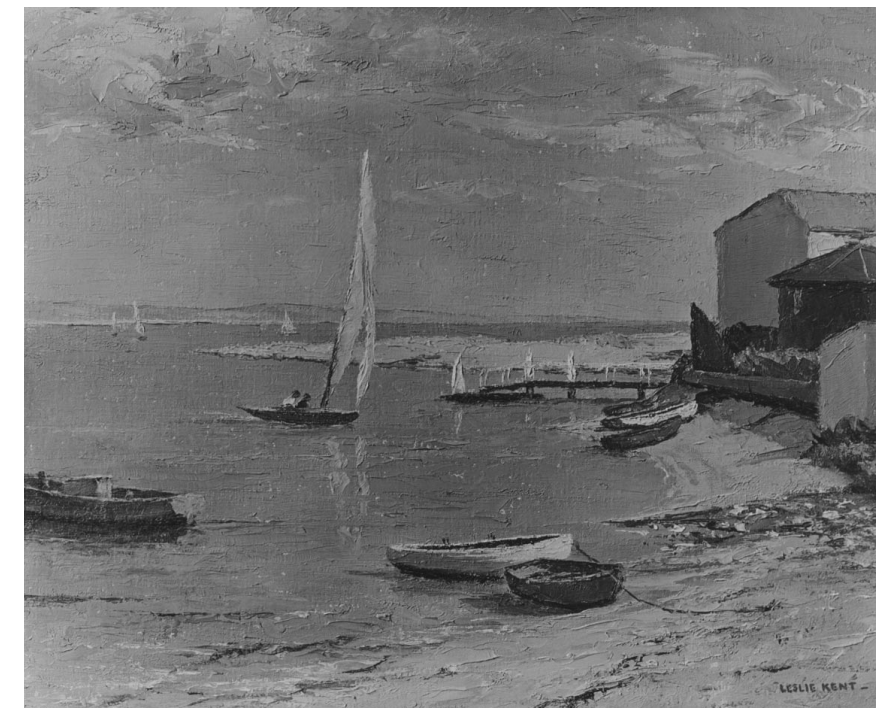
This building is in fact just below the coastguard cottage at Peveril Point, Swanage, which the Kents often rented.

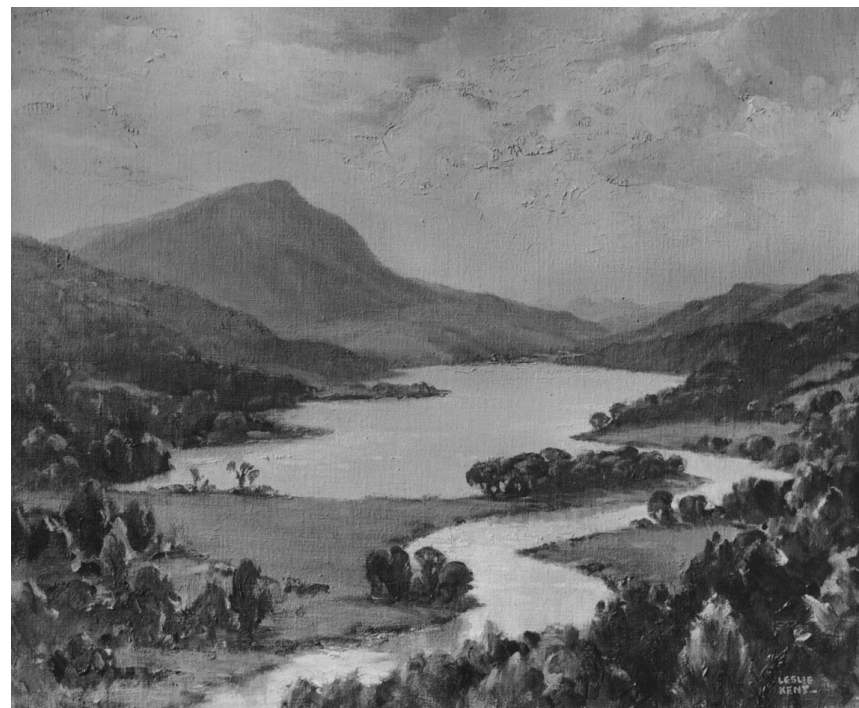

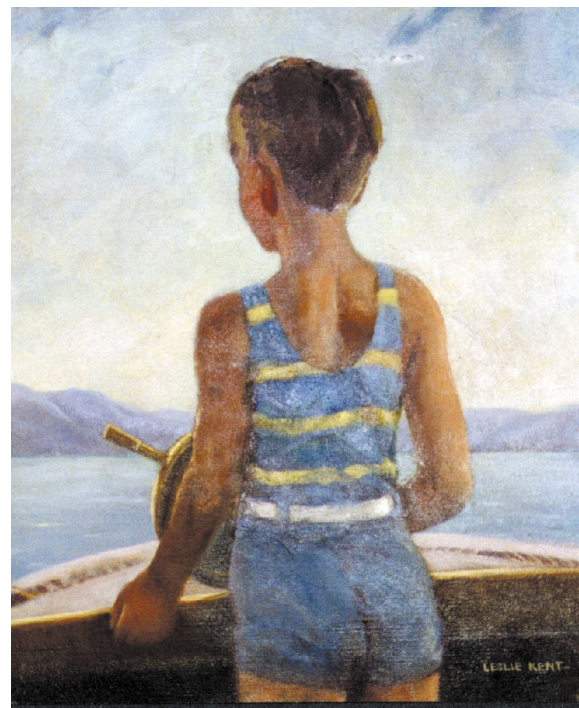

From Pangbourne, David went to Pembroke College, Cambridge, where he read the Mechanical Sciences Tripos. In 1945 he entered the Royal Navy as a Midshipman RNVR, when this picture was painted. Transferring to the RN, he emerged from the RN Engineering College, Manadon, as a Sub-Lieutenant (E). Having been a Cadet RNR at Pangbourne, he had thus served in all three branches of the Navy! After serving in the aircraft carriers *Patroller* and *Illustrious* he was demobbed and joined Sir Alexander Gibb & Partners. In 1954 David joined the family firm, George Kent Ltd. From 1970 to 1986 he was Managing Director of Kent Instruments (New Zealand).

He married Margaret Cumming in 1951, and they have two children, Alistair and Fiona, and six grand-children. In 1999 they returned to New Zealand to live at Christchurch, near Fiona and her family. Alistair, also a Civil Engineer, and family live in Vancouver, Canada.
